# Economically Robust, Smart and Progressive Moradabad

#### Overview

An integrated approach to develop a local area plan has been practiced in India since the 1950s. The 74th Constitutional Amendment has also mandated the same. Uttar Pradesh (UP) has also enacted **the Uttar Pradesh District Planning Committee Act, 1999**, which has helped UP to constitute District Planning Committees for effective development and implementation of the District Plans.

The main purpose of adopting an integrated approach for planning was to ensure that such a plan reflects the needs and aspirations of the people, while helping the convergence of programmes and resources for better outcomes.

The approach towards inclusive planning at the district level is consistent with the global commitment to sustainable development. India has joined 192 other countries to affirm its commitment to the 2030 Agenda and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in 2016. The goals are expected to steer the world towards policies to eradicate poverty, protect the planet, foster peace and promote prosperity for all. As a developing country, these are some of the challenges faced by India as well.

SDGs are a big step forward for achieving equitable and environmentally sustainable economic development. India has taken its commitments of implementing the SDGs very seriously. It has identified nodal agencies and is encouraging State Governments to implement and showcase their contribution towards SDG achievement.

The Government of Uttar Pradesh (UP) has taken up this task on a mission mode. It has identified key departments and developed a state vision document which enables it to implement the SDGs comprehensively.

WWF India in collaboration with Uttar Pradesh State Planning Commission has assessed the integration of SDGS in the district planning exercise in Pilibhit and has developed a broad road map for integrating SDGs into the district planning process.

This document elaborated the steps taken, findngs and some reccomendations on how best to integrate SDGs in the district planning exercise. This exercise has been done in consultation with district administration and UP planning department.

# **District Profile**

Moradabad was established in 1600 by Murad, the son of the Mughal Emperor Shahjahan. Moradabad is situated at a distance of 167 km (104 miles) from the national capital, New Delhi, on the bank of River Ram Ganga (a tributary to the Ganges). Moradabad district lies between 28° 20' and 29° 15' North Latitude and 71° 4' and 71° 6' East Longitude in a rectangular shape. It is bounded by tarai region of district Udham Singh Nagar and district Bijnor in the north, district Budaun in south, district Jyotiba Phule Nagar in west and district Rampur in the east. The average height of the district is 284 mt above sea level. The city is famous for its huge export of brass handicrafts to North America and Europe, thus, it's called 'Brass City' or Peetal Nagri.

The district is administratively divided into 4 tehsils, Moradabad, Kanth, Bilari and Thakurdwara. For implementation of development scheme the district is divided into 8 development blocks, Moradabad, Mundapandey, Bhagatpur Tanda, Bilari, Kundarki, Dilari, Chajlet and Thakurdwara. Total area of the district is 3718 Sq. Km. The rural area covers 3569.7

sq. Km. and urban area is 148.3 sq. KmThere are 1017 Gram Panchayats and 1166 revenue villages with 965 inhabited villages and 201 uninhabited villages in the district. In the urban area there are 10 statutory towns. Statutory Towns comprise of 2 Nagar Palika Parishad and 4 Nagar Panchayats. The population density is 1284 persons per Sq. Km.

Moradabad is a major industrial city and export hub. Its handicrafts industry accounts for more than 40% of total handicraft exports from India.

#### Physiography

On the basis of geology, soils, topography, climate and natural vegetation, the district is divided into the following Submicro regions.

Moradabad Terai: This region is situated on the northern part of the district covering small portions of Thakurdwara and Moradabad tehsils. Its extent is from west-east and slopes towards south. There are numerous streams, which originate from Nainital hills and drain in this tract. These streams are torrential and have wide beds.

Upper Ramganga Plain: The region is situated in the north-eastern part of the district covering mainly Thakurdwara and Moradabad tehsils and partly Bilari tehsil. Physical characteristics of this belt are similar to that of terai. There are numerous streams flowing in this which originate from the nearby district of Nainital. Some streams originate in this region itself. Most of the tributaries are non-perennial but during rainy season they swell in enormous proportion. Besides Ramganga, other streams are Jabdi, Lapkana, Gangan, Kurka, Dhela etc. The slope is comparatively steep. 200metre contour passes through this belt. Along the Ramganga river, patches of sand dunes of Bhur are noticed.

Sambhal Plain: This plain is delimited from Amroha plain by 200-metre contour and lies in Bilari tahsils. It has a very gentle slope towards south-east. River Sot is the main source of water in this area. There are a few tributaries in this region, which are the insignificant. A patch of sand dunes may also be seen on the left corner along the district boundary of Budaun. It is a fertile plain. Geologically the region belongs to Alluvium, Dun gravels.

Drainage: The district is drained by two prominent rivers, the Ganga and the Ramganga and their tributaries. There are also some small rivers like Ban, Gangan, Kosi, Dhela etc. and rainy nullah in the district.

Climate: Being in the proximity of Himalayas and Terai swamps the climate of the district is very hot in summer and severe cold in winter. The hot season starts from the beginning of the February and lasts till the middle of June, followed by the rainy season continues till October. From October to middle of November, a brief period of post monsoon prevails in the district. From mid-November to middle of February is the period of winter season. The maximum and minimum temperature recorded 40-45° C and 35° C respectively. Thus all the four seasons are well marked.

#### Forests

Although there is no dense vegetation in any part of the district, Khadar of Ramganga is mostly covered with Palash. In other region, mainly Shisham, Jamun, Semal, Mango and Siras trees are found. In tahsil Sambhal, *Kaas* (a kind of grass) is found in abundance, which is mainly used for making ban, ropes, mats and stools. Under social forestry scheme, trees are being planted for fuel, wood and other forest produce. No large carnivores are found in the district as forests have thinned by human encroachment. At times, leopard, spotted deer, wild pigs and sambhar can be seen in the northern fringe of the district that enter into this territory probably from the adjoining districts.

#### Soil and Minerals

Soil generally found in the district is clay loamy, balui and sandy. In the southern part of district, the soil is fertile and loamy. The North central part of the district is Bhur region where hilly tract of sand is found along with some fertile land in between and the soil is loamy. From minerals and mining point of view the district has nothing to offer. Kankar (small pieces of stone) is found in some part of Bilari tahsils, which is used for building and road construction work.

#### Agriculture

The economy of the district is predominantly based on agriculture, as majority of the population resides in rural areas and their main occupation is agriculture. Kharif and Rabi are the two principal harvests grown in the district. Wheat occupies the predominant place in terms of area and production. Sugarcane is the most important commercial crop in the district. Potato, tobacco, rice and barley are other main crops of the district. There are godowns in the district that are managed by different agencies. The district also houses cold storages for potatoes and fruits. The district also has seed godowns, fertilizer depots, insecticide depots and seed farms. The land level is plain and fertile land. The total net sown area is 1863.93 sq km (63% of the total geographical area.) Of the total area available for cultivation, most of the area is used as double cropped area. Mostly, the land holdings are generally small in size. 99.5 percent of total cultivable area is irrigated. Tube wells and canals are the major source of irrigation in the district. The area is irrigated through canals, government tube wells, private tube wells, ponds, well and by other sources.

#### Animal Husbandry and Fishery

After agriculture, animal husbandry is the main occupation in rural areas of the district. The district has a total livestock population of 944408. Various livestock like cows, poultry, buffaloes, sheep, goats, horses, ponies, and pigs are reared in the district. Moradabad also has artificial insemination centres, sub-centres, veterinary hospitals, animal welfare centres, pig development centres, centres for the improvement in the breed of cattle and poultry, for the prevention and treatment of animal deceases and the control of epidemics. There is also a factory for producing infant food in Dalpatpur, Mundha Pandey block of the district. To improve breed of animals and making white revolution a success, many development programmes are being run in the district. <u>http://dadf.gov.in/sites/default/filess/Volume%20III-263-515.pdf</u>

Fish are found in the rivers, ponds and artificial reservoirs of the district. The common ones being rohu, karonds, khursa, nain, catla, rewa, sol, girai, patra, tengra, parhin and singhi. Ponds are given on lease to fishermen by the district authorities. Fishery department also has a pond which is used for pisciculture. The total area under fisheries cultivation is 987.033 hectares out of 879.862 hectares is covered by 1567 community ponds, 40.023 hectares is covered by 6 fisheries department ponds and 67.148 hectares is covered by 94 private ponds. Fish seed hatcheries and rearing units (nurseries) in private sector are also established in the district to boost fish production. Apart from this, there are 2 hatcheries that cover an area of 0.800 hectares and rearing units (nurseries) are 18 in number covering 7.6 hectares. The district also has one fisheries department farm which covers 1.45 hectares of area and one fisheries estate named Bhartalmadapur covering 14 hectares of area. <u>http://fisheries.upsdc.gov.in/Portals/0/VisonDoc%20.pdf</u>

#### Industry and Trade

The district has been industrially backward and yet industrial development has caught on with the expansion of traditional handicrafts and small-scale industries. These products are not only sold countrywide but are also exported abroad. Brass art objects, utility articles and utensils are exported to the USA, West Germany, Canada, Iran, Iraq, Egypt, UK and other European and southeast Asian countries. Manufacturing of brass articles occupies the foremost position in the manufacturing activities of the district and is concentrated in Moradabad town, which has earned the nickname of 'Pital Nagri'. The production of western type combs, toys and beautiful show pieces are the latest addition to the array of products of this industry. To provide ample opportunities for the expansion of these industries in the district, the state Government had established a UP State Brass Ware Corporation in 1972. This institution has not only been helping industries in procurement of raw material but also in marketing of their products at remunerative rates in India and abroad. The infrastructure built up by the development of brass industry includes the development of other small-

scale industries. The manufacture of stainless steel and aluminium utensils is catching up hastily and numerous such units have come up. There are factories that are registered under Factory Act of 1948.

Electricity and Power. All the 10 towns of the district are electrified, 952 villages (98.6 percent), out of 965 inhabited villages are electrified by central electricity authorities. The consumption of electricity is in the fields of domestic light sector, commercial sector, industrial sector, public light sector, agriculture sector and public water supply and sewerage system etc. The government and private tube wells and pump sets have been electrified.

Export: UK, USA, Middle East Asia, Germany and Canada import brassware from Moradabad. There are about 600 export units and 9000 industries in the district. Moradabad exports goods worth INR 4500 crore yearly. Many other products like iron sheet, metal wares, aluminum, artworks and glassware are also exported. Mint export worth several crores is also taking place from Moradabad. Due to upsurge of exports and popularity overseas particularly in the US, Europe, Italy and other countries, a large number of exporters are launching their own manufacturing units and have started export. Moradabad is one of the seven industrial corridors declared by the State Government in Industrial Policy 1999-2002.

Special Economic Zone: Moradabad Special Economic Zone (SEZ) is the only Uttar Pradesh Government Developed SEZ in northern India. It is headed by the Development Commissioner, Noida SEZ and locally governed by the Assistant Development Commissioner. It was set up in 2003 at Pakbara – Dingarpur Road in Moradabad on a 421.56 acres plot of land. Government of UP through UPSIDC has so far invested a sum of INR 1100 million on the development of the SEZ project. Moradabad SEZ provides excellent infrastructure, supportive services and sector specific facilities for the Handicraft Trade. Proximity to Delhi/NCR and availability of skilled and dedicated manpower makes it ideal for setting up various industries in Handicrafts and its allied fileds. Moradabad SEZ was operationalized in April 2007 when it started with only one unit, however, despite global slowdown in the handicraft trade in the past four years, this zone has now 22 operational Units. Moradabad SEZ has 465 developed plots of varying sizes. Future expansion of this has been strategically planned and soon it will be available for a few more export sectors.

Infrastructure supportive services and trade related facilities have been substantially upgraded in the last few years. Moradabad SEZ offers access to global telecommunication network, uninterrupted power supply and efficient local transport system. An ultra-modern RSU Telephone Exchange has been installed in the Zone, besides the availability of all the mobile frequencies in and around the zone through various mobile communication towers. Since an independent feeder line has been provided for uninterrupted power supply, the reliability and quality of power supply has improved with the pre-commissioned 32 / 11 KVA / 5.0 MVA Power Sub-station within Moradabad SEZ. Proximity to Delhi/ NCR provides easy access to financial and commercial infrastructure of the capital. Customs Wing ensures prompt and on the spot clearances of export/import consignments through web based system called "Sez online".

# Transport

The district is well connected by rail network. There is double railway line between Moradabad and Rampur. There are a number of railway stations in the district. The district is also well connected by road transport as major national highway and state highways pass through the district. Means of road transport available in the district are State Road Transport Corporation buses and private buses, taxi, jeeps, trucks etc. The district has a total road network of 2063 km.

# **Broad Methodology**

- 1) Meeting with State Planning Department to identify Moradabad as a district to develop a model plan.
- 2) Meetings with District Magistrate and Chief Development Officer in Moradabad to initiate discussions on SDGs and way ahead for developing the model plan.

- 3) Identification of nodal departments by the DM for initiating this work. Thirty-one nodal departments were selected. (List attached in annexure 1)
- 4) Awareness cum sensitization workshop on Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and India Vision 2022 organized for the department officials of Moradabad district on 17<sup>th</sup> March 2018 in the Collectorate office, Moradabad. The workshop was chaired by the CDO, by Ms. C. Indumati. This workshop was the first step towards informing the departments about the 2030 agenda and what steps are needed for developing an integrated plan. The workshop was attended by sixteen departments out of the twenty-three departments that were invited.

Some of the takeaways from the workshop were-

- Schemes should follow a demand based approach instead of a supply based approach.
- The disaggregated data and data that is relevant needs to be collected from the field.
- E data needs to be collected from all departments.
- Spatial mapping of scheme benefits across all blocks/HH needs to be done to see if the distribution of benefits is spread evenly



6) There are 169 targets for all the 17 Goals. Of these, a total of 80 targets are not applicable at the district level as they are either global targets or thematic targets which can need to be covered at the national or state level. (List attached in annexure 2)

5) Mapping of goals and targets that are relevant to district

There are a total of 17 Sustainable Development goals of which only 15 are relevant to the district. Two SDGs i.e. Goal 14 – Life Below Water and Goal 17- Partnerships for the Goals are not applicable to the district.




APPLICABLE GOAL AND TARGET NUMBERS



7) WWF India collected information related to number of schemes listed department wise in UP. A total of 350 schemes were listed for 31 short listed departments as per Government websites and documents. These schemes were then mapped department wise. There are a total of 78 departments in the state as per the UP Government website. Of these there are 50 departments which do not function at the district level or have no bearing on the development and planning process of the district. (List attached in annexure 8)

8) For Moradabad we also checked to see the total number of working schemes in the district for the year 2017-2018. Till date we have information that 199 schemes are working in the district in 2017-18. The rest are currently not functioning in the district.

#### 9) Mapping of working schemes vis a vis relevant SDG targets

All the department wise schemes were mapped with the SDG targets. Data was also taken from documents like the NITI Aayog SDG Mapping Document and UP SDG Mapping Document. The document with Schemes mapped against SDG Targets has been attached in Annexure 3.

10) Listing of SDG targets that are not be being covered by any schemes

During the mapping it was seen that some of the targets are not being covered by any schemes. The list is mentioned in Annexure 4

11) Listing of schemes that are not contributing to any targets

There are 25 schemes that do not contribute to any target. List attached in Annexure 5.

12) Data Collection-

Multiple rounds of data collection from 28 departments have been done. Two types of data sheets circulated in the departments i.e. infrastructure/ amenities related and beneficiary related. (see annexure 6)

13) Data of 84 schemes have been collected for the 2017-18.

Data for the remaining working schemes have not been made available despite repeated requests. Of the 84 schemes for which data has been made available, there is village level beneficiary data for 34 schemes, block level data for 8 schemes and district level data for 36 schemes. A table given below indicates the data availability and type of data provided. A detailed list for schemes for which data has been collected is attached separately (Annexure 7)


The following GIS Map layers for the district have been sourced.






Department wise Contribution to SDG Targets


An assessment to see which departments contribute to most SDG targets was done and it was seen that Department of rural development, women and child development and labour contribute most to SDG targets



The following charts represent coverage of SDG targets in different categories:








Coverage Analysis of Beneficiary Level Schemes



- 4) 4 villages have no schemes working
- 5) 12 villages are un-inhabited villages





# District Plan Schemes

An analysis of the schemes run under the district plan was also taken up. It was seen that there are only 91 schemes under the district plan. However, there are over 330 schemes in the district of which it was seen that only 147 were working. The common schemes between dsitrict plan schemes and all schemes were only 34. The remaining district plan schemes if working also contribute to SDG Targets. See table below

Efficient implementation of schemes is an issue, to ensure which a comprehensive system of measuring, reporting and verification of indicators is needed. We recommend that the following processes be initiated for effective and comprehensive monitoring and feedback like public hearing and social audits periodically






